Dear Georgia Teachers:

I am writing today to tell you about a special opportunity to receive a \$500 educational grant from the Georgia Agribusiness Council. The 2018 Dr. Joe B. Crane Classroom Grant Program will award up to four Georgia teachers this money to teach agriculture in the classroom.

“Dr. Joe” joined the Georgia Agribusiness Council Board of Directors in 1986. On this board, he served on the education committee for many years and always championed the Council’s educational efforts. Education was always very important to Dr. Joe, as he served thirty-one years on the Valdosta City Board of Education. The Dr. Joe B. Crane Classroom Grant program was initiated by him and later named in his honor. He passed away in October 2006.

The Georgia Agribusiness Council is pleased to offer up to four Georgia teachers \$500 to help fund special classroom projects through this program. We want to provide you the resources needed to bring agriculture to your students in an interesting and thoughtful way.

Purpose: To provide grant assistance to four Georgia teachers in order to fund special classroom projects aimed at teaching agriculture.

Funds: Proceeds are derived from the Georgia Agribusiness Council and donations from other agricultural businesses.

Award: Four grants at \$500; Grant recipient to be awarded money in December 2018.

Judging: The selection of the scholarship winner is made by the Education Committee of the Georgia Agribusiness Council and is based on the criteria listed below.

Deadline: Applications are due postmarked by October 15, 2018. Winners will be announced in November and receive their award before the end of the year.

Criteria: Applicant must be a Georgia teacher, public or private. You do not have to be an agriculture teacher to apply. Any Georgia teacher is eligible to receive funding.

Requirements: Please mail, e-mail or fax page 2 of this application along with separate page answers for the six questions on page 3 to our office.

Ideas for Proposals

- Environmental stewardship of farming practices (safe use of fertilizers & chemicals)
- Food & Fiber production and processing (how crops make it from the farm to the table)
- Environmental Impacts on plant/livestock production (Impacts of drought, flooding, disease, etc.)
- How to manage the business of farming (planting, harvesting, marketing, selling, etc.)
- How agriculture is growing the renewable fuels of the future (ethanol and biodiesel sources)
- How laws and regulations have changed agriculture (water use, fertilizer, chemicals, safety, etc.)

Past Winning Projects

- Fourth grade students planted gardens in empty school courtyard and learned about fertilizer and chemical use, marketing a product and plant & soil science.
- High school agriculture students introduced an agricultural awareness day to the rest of the student body.
- Kindergarteners participated in "Farm Fridays," using different letters of the alphabet to learn about different types of agriculture.
- Third grade students planted a square foot garden and monitored plant growth and progress, soil levels and water use.

Selected projects will be required to submit a progress report with photo documentation both during the project and after the project's completion. The project should be completed within twelve months of receipt of funds.
